Cookies

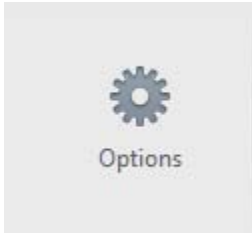
Key generation

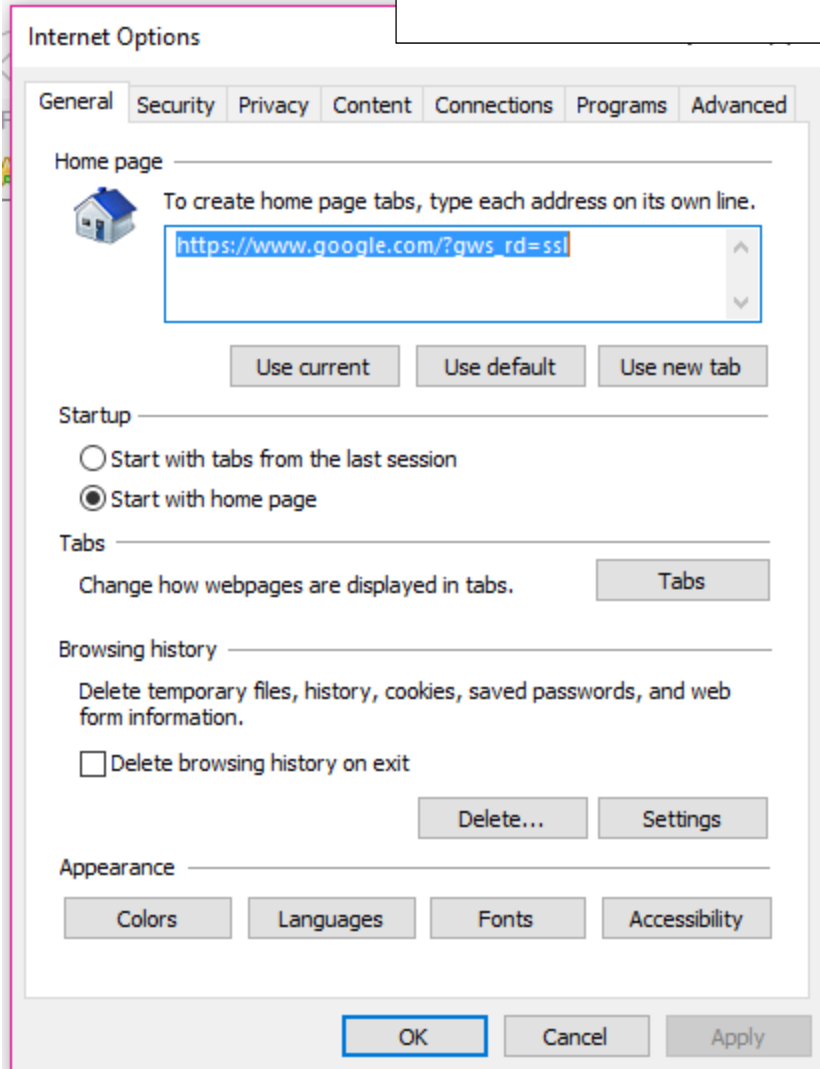

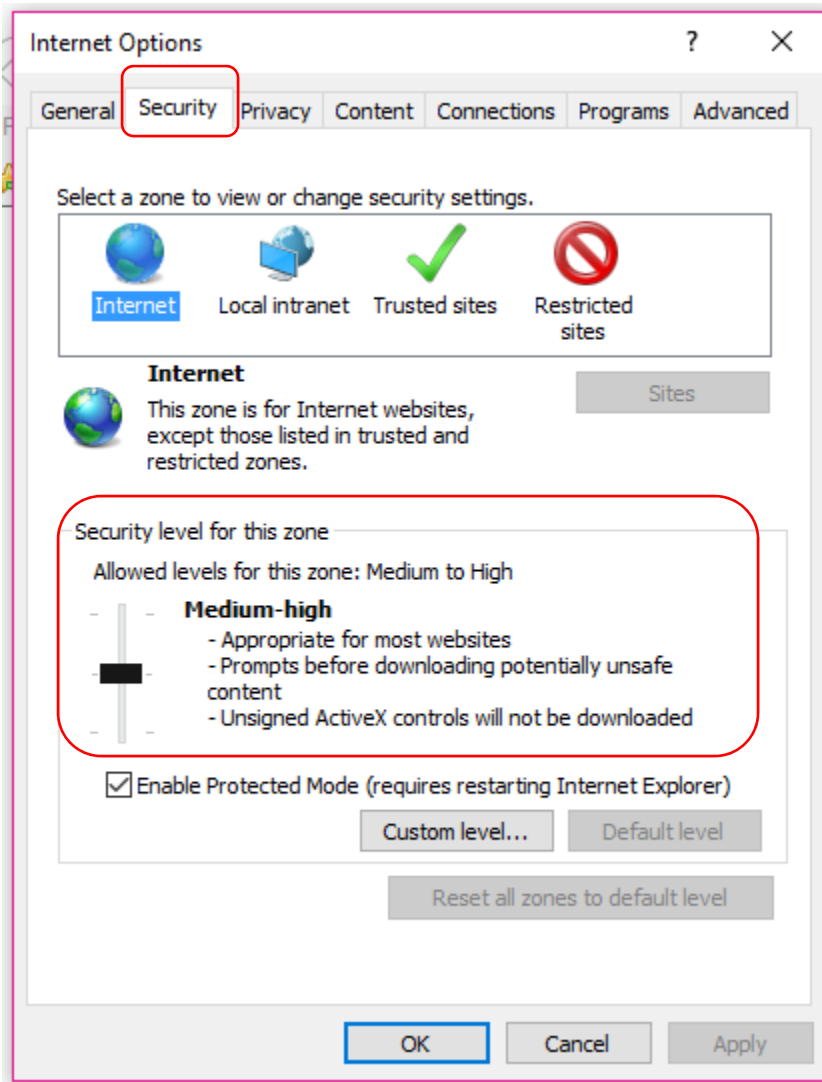
